

# Allied Health Rural Clinical Placement Support Program



## Allied Health Rural Clinical Placement Support Program Guidelines

Rural Health West's Allied Health Rural Clinical Placement Support Program aims to provide financial support to allied health students completing a clinical placement in rural Western Australia. Successful applicants may be awarded up to \$800.00 depending on placement location, type of placement and availability of funding.

The program offers financial support for travel and accommodation costs associated with the clinical placement. Rural Western Australia refers to locations rated Modified Monash Model (MM) 3-7 locations.

### Who is eligible?

#### Students must be:

- Currently studying in a full-time or part-time capacity.
- Currently enrolled to study at one of the Western Australian universities - Curtin University, Edith Cowan University, Murdoch University, The University of Notre Dame Australia Fremantle, or The University of Western Australia.
- Studying one of the disciplines listed below.
- A member of a Student Rural Health Club:

### Guidelines

- Eligible clinical placements must occur between 01 January 2022 and 30 June 2022.
- Eligible clinical placements must be located in a MM 3-7 location. Visit the Health Workforce Locator at [www.health.gov.au/resources/apps-and-tools/health-workforce-locator](http://www.health.gov.au/resources/apps-and-tools/health-workforce-locator) for MM classifications.
- Students must be enrolled in one of the eligible allied health disciplines listed above.

- Students must be a member of a Student Rural Health Club. Please see above for website links to apply.
- Students located in a Western Australian rural region (see MM 3-7 locations) enrolled externally with a university not based in Western Australia are eligible to apply for the support program. Students must provide details of current institution and placement location. This will be approved on a case-by-case basis.
- Grant payments can only be used to assist with travel and/or accommodation expenses.
- Students must provide a signed letter of clinical placement from their University Clinical Coordinator on university letterhead specifying placement dates, placement location and name of health service.
- Student must include the type of placement when submitting their application. Definitions of placement types are outlined as follows:

**Primary Health Care** Placement in a community-based setting including general practice, private practice, community health or aged care

**Mixed** Combination of primary health and hospital placement

**Hospital** Placement completed in a hospital setting

- Applicants may be asked to submit extra evidence of their placement type following the submission of their application.
- Following the clinical placement, students are required to provide a 300-word statement outlining their placement experiences and three placement photos highlighting their rural experience to be used to market the program to prospective students. See grant claim form.
- Financial support is capped at \$800.00 and is tiered depending on location and length.
- Application closing date: 6<sup>th</sup> May 2022.
- Applications may still be assessed until funding is exhausted.
- The funding round opens 01 January 2022. Applicants will receive an email notification confirming receipt of application.
- All applications will be assessed following the application closing date for the funding round. All students will receive notification of the outcome of their application following the closing date via email. A claim form is then sent and will need to be completed and emailed back for payment in to your bank account.
- Applications will remain confidential.
- Applications will be assessed by Rural Health West and decisions are final.

## How to apply?

- Complete and return the Allied Health Rural Clinical Placement Support Program application form.
- Submit written evidence of clinical placement from your university in the form of a letter on university letterhead from Clinical Coordinator specifying placement location, placement dates and name of health service/s.
