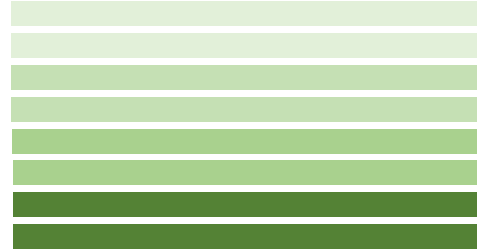

#DestinationRural Initiative – Rural Doctors Association Australia



Medical Students and junior doctors have been invited to a number of events over the past 6 months to showcase the diverse and rewarding careers rural and remote medicine has to offer. A number of events have already been held in Narrogin and Geraldton with the latest event held at the University of Western Australia campus, Perth. On Wednesday 5th February 2020. Over 60 students and junior medical officers (JMOs) attended the Medical Students and Junior Doctors event held at the Clinical Training and Evaluation Centre (CTEC), University of Western Australia Campus for an informal get together to learn more about rural and remote medicine across all specialties.



Peta Rutherford, CEO, Rural Doctors Association of Australia spoke about the wonderful career and lifestyle choices available when working and living in rural and remote locations. Peta showed a videos from the Kimberley region which demonstrated the broad range of medical experiences on offer and the fantastic training and supervision that medical students and junior doctors received with one on one personal contact with their supervisor. Andrew Kirke, Head of The Rural Clinical School of Western Australia and President of the Rural Doctors' Association of Western Australia spoke about his experiences doing an elective in Kununurra and working as a rural GP proceduralist in remote locations such as Derby and Kalgoorlie. He is now working as a GP in Bunbury. He spoke about the benefits of working as a student with The Rural Clinical School of Western Australia in the 15 locations across Western Australia and the level of support, supervision and experiences provided in each of those locations. He also discussed the opportunities available for final year students to stay in the location where they completed their RCS training. Currently this is only available in a couple of locations.



There was keen interest from both students and JMOs on what rotations were available in the regions, particularly for interns and JMO positions. Dr David Oldham, Director, WA Country Health Service Medical Education Unit was able to discuss the increase in intern positions in Bunbury and Albany and the other regions coming on board in a year or two. Most of the attendees were students from The University of Western Australia, Notre Dame University and Curtin University but it was also good to see a handful of junior doctors. Also, some of the attendees were on the Rural Medical Bonded Program. The prize for attending was a stethoscope provided by the Rural Doctors Association of Australia and won by Callum Burns, student from The University of Western Australia.
